

UCLA LITERATURE AND THE ENVIRONMENT MINOR

To enter the minor, students must be in good academic standing with an overall grade-point average of 2.0 or better and have completed English 4W, 4HW, 4WS, or any Writing II course, with a grade of C or better. To declare the minor, students should meet with a Department of English undergraduate advisor in Kaplan 158 or 160.

Preparation for the Minor: 2 courses

Any Writing II course _____ English M30: Introduction to Environmental Humanities _____

- A grade of C or better is required for all preparatory courses.
- All courses used to fulfill requirements for the minor must be 4 or 5 units and taken for a letter grade.
- No more than 2 Upper Division courses for the minor may be taken during Summer Sessions or outside of UCLA.
- At least 20 units of coursework must be exclusive to the minor.

D. 1 Capstone Course

Capstone options include an English 184 seminar with an environmental focus, an environmentally-focused internship course (195CE), a senior Honors thesis (198A-B), or an independent study course (197 or 199) culminating in a project focused primarily on literature from an ecocritical or other environmentally focused perspective.

Course contract or petition may be required.
